In May and June, we built a foundation of creative collaboration for our July 26th event. Numerous meetings with dynamic change makers in the neighborhood complemented our outreach to artists, storytellers, and community leaders. The

common thread of conversation? West Oakland's past, viewed in the context of generating positive change ahead.



We are proud to join critical revitalizations in West Oakland that have nurtured the neighborhood with breakthrough ideas and effort. Our respect for the work of people like Noni Sessions, steadfast supporters of the 16th Street Train Station, and the Center for ArtEsteem inspires us to celebrate their work. It's a culture of action we call the Creative Community.

Sudden disruptions that are lacerating culture nationally give our special role at West Oakland Matters dramatic urgency. Time we spend with existing organizations allows us to focus attention to youth *and* elders; new businesses *and* city government; preservation *and* development; cultural historians *and* community visionaries.

The local artist and educator Cynthia Brannvall eloquently identifies our purpose:

"Artists harness the power of artistic expression as a catalyst for new possibilities to spark dialogue, inspire action, and promote changes for the future we want to create."

During June, we are committed to programming our event in a way that reflects our supporters and enhances their varied activities. One example is the planned participation of groups like Oakland Heritage Alliance (OHA), which will lead a walking tour on July 26 that ends at our event, and 7th Street THRIVES, which reenvisions the famous strip on the basis of local community values. Inspired by work like theirs, we have taken on a stronger profile as an engaging partner who emphasizes where art and culture are built into the community by creatives leading existing organizations.


